EARTH CAMP

Earth Camp is an exciting day camp opportunity Monday through Friday, 9:00 am—3:00 pm for children 6-12 to enjoy outdoor recreation while learning about nature. Each of the 5 weeks during the summer has a unique theme and all includes swimming, horseback riding, music, arts and crafts, games, hiking and nature exploration. SPLASH ZONE is in partnership with Earth Camp. Program begins June 20-24, and ends with week 5, July 12-22, 2011. Camp fee is \$180 per week (\$165 if registered by May 1, 2011.) Scholarships available.

Children must pack a lunch, except Fridays, when a cookout provides hot dogs, potato chips, fruits, and drink

Bus transportation is available for a \$20 fee per week.

For Teens Age 13-16: Teen Leadership Camp provides a fun and challenging opportunity for teens ages 13-16. Teen Leadership Camp offers fun summer camp activities such as hiking and nature exploration combined with experiential activities, games, and interactive discussions designed to enhance leadership skills and build developmental assets such as self-esteem, teamwork, and effective communication. Program begins June 20-24, and ends with week 5, July 12-22, 2011. Cost: \$180 per week; attend as many weeks as you want.. Scholarships available. **Transportation available for a \$20 fee per week.**

CAMP NUHOP

Camp Nuhop is a **residential camp for children with learning disabilities, attention deficit disorder and behavior disorders.** (The camp is not appropriate for severe mental retardation or physical disability.) The summer camp offers 13 different age-sorted camping experiences for up to 560 children supervised by 45 staff members. The registration process is quite involved so that campers are evaluated and placed appropriately by age and developmental level. Campers experience a variety of outdoor experiences while enhancing personal and interpersonal skills. They participate in water sports, science camp, wilderness camp, discovery camp, expedition camp.

In-N-Out Of The City Summer Camp

In-n-Out of the City is a therapeutic summer camp offered at EA Willoughby Hills where youth can interact with peers and camp staff to help them grow in their social development. The therapeutic environment, qualified staff and unique program design are appropriate for meeting the mental health needs of at-risk youth. Youth participate in a variety of on-site activities and off-site field trips, including arts and crafts, outdoor sports, and teambuilding exercises. Field trips include the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo, Great Lakes Science Center, and a cookout at the beach each Friday!

Learn to Earn Summer Program

Learn to Earn is an interactive, eight-week program to help youth ages 14 and older develop age-appropriate social skills that can help them succeed as adults. The program incorporates hands-on activities and a service learning component where students work on houses in Slavic Village that are then rented by families in need of housing. Also, students are able to earn high school credit for their participation in the program!

For students entering the 9th and 10th grades from the following school districts:

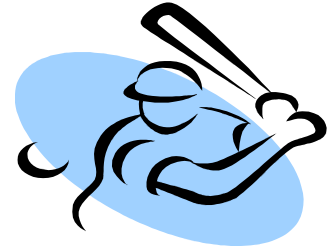

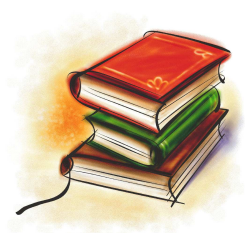
